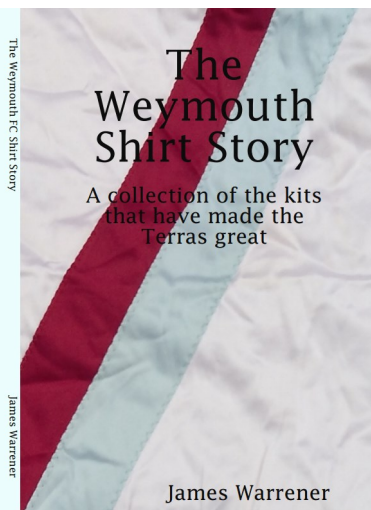
## What's in Store ?

### League form needed please...

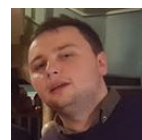
It's a bizarre season to be following Weymouth, even by our standards.
